Institutional Assistance Grants Program

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Program Overview

The Institutional Assistance Grants (IAG) Program serves as an integral part of the Commonwealth's commitment to the development and preservation of a planned system of postsecondary education. The IAG Program was created by legislation of the General Assembly in July 1974 and is administered by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA). The program meets its objectives through formula grants to assist independent postsecondary institutions in maintaining enrollments and stabilizing their educational costs to facilitate utilization of all postsecondary education resources in the Commonwealth.

As specified in the authorizing legislation, independent, not-for-profit colleges and universities eligible for the Pennsylvania State Grant Program can participate in the IAG Program. Appropriation legislation for the last several years has excluded from participation any institution that is the recipient of a direct state appropriation. There were 89 eligible institutions in the IAG Program for the 2015-16 Academic Year. IAG payments are based on the number of full-time equivalent State Grant recipients certified as enrolled at IAG-eligible institutions during an academic year.

The total available resources are divided by the total number of certified recipients to establish a per capita grant for each institution. An advanced payment of approximately 90 percent of the projected entitlement is given to the institutions in the fall, to allow the IAG funds to be a meaningful part of schools' budgets. A final reconciliation payment is made the following spring to complete payment to the colleges. Each institution must execute a Participation Agreement and must submit an annual audit report as assurance that the IAG monies are used for non-sectarian educational costs.

In this report, disbursed funds for an individual year may exceed the appropriation because resources may include interest, refunds, and funds carried forward from previous years. The disbursed funds shown are final for 2005-06 through 2014-15. The disbursed funds for 2015-16 are not final, but reflect data as of August 3, 2016.
